## WHERE? SAYULITA, NAYARIT RIVIERA, MEXICO

WHO GOES? Kim K, Jennifer Aniston and Alessandra Ambrosio have all stayed along this luxe stretch of Pacific coast. The jewel in the crown is the small town of Sayulita, which is populated by the hippy surf crowd, plus their hip urban counterparts.

WHY? Dubbed 'the new Tulum',
Sayulita, on the west coast near
Puerto Vallarta, combines an
off-the-radar vibe with urban
necessities (think iced Americanos
and yoga studios). No-frills beach
bars stand alongside organic taco
spots and rustic guesthouses.

WHERE TO STAY: The Petit Hotel Hafa is an adorable, six-room hotel in the centre of town, where Mexican, Moroccan and Mediterranean influences meet in one colourful surf retreat. For something even more relaxing, Playa Escondida offers private villas and beach huts dotted around a blissfully quiet beach. 

## WHERE? BÚZIOS, BRAZIL

WHO GOES? Mick Jagger and family, Madonna, stylish cariocas from nearby Rio de Janeiro, and an abundance of bronzed Argentinians (so many, in fact, that the area is now nicknamed 'Búzios Aires').







WHY? Ever since a holidaying Brigitte Bardot put this fishing town on the map in the 1960s, Búzios has held a reputation as one of Brazil's most alluring coastal towns – and when World Cup fever took over earlier this year, the beautiful people began descending once again. In this tropical paradise, private coves are offset by cool bars and restaurants. Hit the stunning beaches, then feast on fresh seafood and caipirinhas.

WHERE TO STAY: Right on the beach at Villa Balthazar, a tropical pousada (B&B) where the Swedish owners have created an airy Scandi retreat with colourful vintage touches. Sleep off cocktails in one of five tranquil rooms, then head on to the back deck for a breakfast of tropical fruit.
